GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

One unit of credit shall be awarded for the successful completion of a planned course of at least 130 clock hours.

A semester course is worth one-half unit, and a full-year course is worth one unit of credit.

College Preparatory Diploma – 26-30 total credits

-English – 4 credits

-Math – 4 credits

(may include one credit college level course) (all math at the Algebra I level or higher may include one credit college level course)

-Science – 4 credits

(may include one credit college level course)

-Foreign Language -- 4 credits

(may include one credit college level course)

-Social Studies -- 3-4 credits

(may include one credit college level course)

-Physical Education -- 1 credit

-Health Education -- 1 credit

-Electives -- 5-8 credits

(include advisory and may include classes at Sheridan High School)



COURSES OFFERED AND FOUR-YEAR ROTATION SCHEDULE

Four-Year Rotation Schedule:

The curriculum content for **Language Arts**, **Social Studies**, and **Science** rotations follow a **four-year cycle**. Each year the curriculum has a focus on one historical time period and geographical area and/or scientific area.

Consequently, students who attend SJS from grades 4 through 12 receive each cycle twice, building on prior content knowledge.

Foreign Language (Japanese) and Mathematics do not follow a four-year rotation; levels are determined by proficiency.

Courses Offered:

Japanese: Beginning (I-II) / Intermediate(A-C) /Advanced (A-C) / AP / Japanese 201-203 (College-level through College Credit Now)

Science: Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Earth Science

History: World Area Studies , Modern European History, Medieval European History , US History Comprehensive

English: English Language Arts/Lit I, II, III, IV

Literature: World/Asian Lit., European/British Lit. Mythology/Medieval/European Lit., American/Immigration Lit.

Math: Pre-Algebra, Algebra I (Part 1 and 2), Algebra II Geometry, Probabilities/Statistics, Trigonometry Pre-Calculus, Calculus

AP Exams: Environmental Sci., Japanese, English Lang. & Comp., English Lang. & Lit. Composition US History, Calculus AB, Biology

Additional Courses: Leadership (Advisory), Health, P.E.

SCHOOL DESCRIPTION

The Sheridan Japanese School is a charter school founded by parents and teachers who wanted to provide their children with an academically challenging, college preparatory, and public education. Located in Yamhill County, Oregon.

Currently SJS serves 88 students from fourth through twelfth grade. Class sizes in the lower grades do not exceed twenty-four; the upper middle, and high school class sizes average 20.
